Brad Lackey and Moto-X Fox

This year's issue is dedicated to Brad Lackey, the first American to win a World Motocross Championship. The garnering of the 500cc title at the end of 1982 season marked the end of a ten year quest for Brad and the realization of what had to be the ultimate lifetime goal.

It was a goal which began back in Czechoslovakia in 1970 when, at the age of 17, Brad had been invited by CZ to visit the factory, train, and race in a few selected 250cc Grand Prix events. Having to live in a shack with no electricity behind the factory, bathe in a nearby creek, and work on his own bikes did nothing to dampen his enthusiasm for Europe.

Brad returned to America where in 1972 he won the newly established 500cc National Championship riding for Kawasaki. From that point on the only goal left for Brad was to return to Europe and go after the 500cc World Championship. So began a ten year quest for Brad that saw him sacrificing fame and fortune in America to fight the toughest opponents the sport had ever seen. Riders like DeCoster, Wolsink, Aberg, Noyce, Jonnson, Mahlerbe and Carlquist. He rode for Husqvarna, for Honda and for Kawasaki twice before finally realizing the title with Suzuki of Japan. Ironically along the way his passion for Europe alienated him from many in American motocross. But those were the sacrifices Brad chose to make in his quest for the Ultimate Championship.

It was toward that goal of winning the 500cc World Championship that Brad and Moto-X Fox have worked together for so many years. Our relationship began in 1975 when Brad helped test Fox Airshox and used them on his factory Husqvaranas. From there our support evolved with the introduction of our new line of motocross riding gear. Brad helped establish our credibility as one of the world's leading manufacturers and distributors in the sport and his personal input has always been instrumental in helping us improve our products.
