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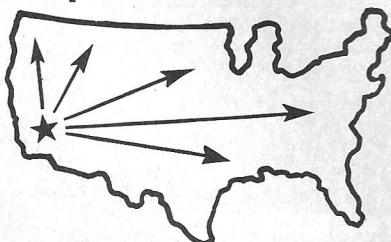

STOP PRESS NEWS ISLE OF MAN RESULTS!

BULLETIN: AS WE GO TO PRESS, RESULTS OF THE WORLD'S MOST FAMOUS RACING CLASSIC, THE ISLE OF MAN TT, ARE JUST REACHING OUR OFFICES. THE FOLLOWING IS A CONDENSED SUMMARY OF THE EVENTS TO DATE. SIDECAR WIN SETS RECORD.

Max Deubel and passenger, Emil Horner, made it three in a row as they swept the Isle of Man sidecar class win with a record average speed of 90.57 mph. Deubel, who rides BMW rigs, is the current world champion sidecar racer. This was the first time a sidecar race has been won at over 90 mph at the Isle.

The German team edged out second place Fritz Scheidegger of Switzerland and his English passenger, John Robinson, by only 14 seconds. They, too, were on a BMW, as was the third place team, Auerbacher and Rykers.

The winning team was seriously challenged only once, by Florian Camathias, who was later forced out with clutch trouble.

HONDA WINS 250, SETS RECORD!

Jim Redman on a six cylinder Honda was the first man ever to break the 100 mph mark lap speed on a 250cc machine at the famed Isle of Man race in England. His race average was 97.19 mph.

The race began with a furious 100-plus mph duel between Yamaha-mounted Phil Read, reigning world champion, and Redman. But luck turned against Read. On the second lap the ultra-hot Yamaha twin was forced out with a broken crankshaft, paving the way to an easy win for Redman, Honda's top team member.

Second place went to Canadian Mike Duff, Yamaha's number two man. Duff placed 40.8 seconds behind Redman. Suzuki rider, Frank Perris, sewed up third position and Tarquinio Provini took fourth on a Benelli "4".
